Introduction

Since 1996, the role of the Breast Care Nurse is supported and funded by the Israel Cancer Association.

There are now about 40 Breast Care Nurses working in different centers in Israel.





Introduction (cont.)

This unique working group of BCNs meets every few weeks in the Israel Cancer Association.

These regular meetings of the Breast Care Nurses are especially to train the group, discuss common concerns, consulting with each other, developing some new ideas and for a social gathering.



The Curriculum for the BCNs in Israel a. Formal education

The BCNs have **academic degree**.

They all have also a **certificate in advanced course in general oncology.**

The oncology module includes 329 hours of theoretical study and 160 hours of clinical practice.

Learning through **lectures in the community to healthy population** related prevention and early detection of breast cancer




Perceptions of Israeli women with breast cancer regarding the role of the breast care nurse : A multi-center study (a)



87% of the women reported that the general contribution of the BCN was very high or high

(Internal reliability: Cronbach alpha 0.87)






Perceptions of Israeli women with breast cancer regarding the role of the breast care nurse : A multi-center study (b)



Timing of Initial Encounter with Breast Care Nurse (%)

87.1% of the women thought that it was the right timing for them

For the majority of the women (\sim 70%), most of the **practical support** provided was adequate




Perceptions of Israeli women with breast cancer regarding the role of the breast care nurse : A multi-center study (d)



Psychosocial Support: The BCNs was helpful in terms of coping with the diagnosis (78%) and with

encouraging expression and management of feelings (67%).



(Internal reliability: Cronbach alpha 0.92)





The group of the Israeli breast care nurses Invests a lot of thoughts and motivations how to catch up and learn continually in different methods.

We do need some formal curriculum specific for Breast Care Nurse.

A working Group of BCN has started already an important process for this formal recognition for these nurses as clinical specialist by the ministry of health, including the construction of a formal curriculum.
